Red tape in using money has been a serious proble – get some feel for it. Why are disbursement so slow? Gather the Gov't must pay out in Taka & then get reimbursed

3/18 Red taped a whole / saw Trevos Williams & bob Pickel – date tomorrow at 9:30 am. Saw Mr. Wignell who deals w/ seeds in general but not jute. Poetenay is the man to see, but he is out and so is Barmmer. So began reading series annual reports – notes follow:

{Let me skip his notes on these reports. So, JRH spends a few days in Rome getting ready for this rather unusual assignment – to go to India & Bangladesh and try to figure out what is wrong with the Jute industry there – well at least what is wrong with the Jute improvement part of the industry.]

3/19/ Checked out & brought bag to FAO. Plane does not leave until 11:00 pm tonight.

More reports: {I will leave this out]

Bob Pickel on international conservation [?] He wants my ideas on it. / don't think it will gel.

Should contact Keith Aukland at ADB in Manilla – he could pay a visit. Brian Webster will do this for me. Brian is retiring soon & will be replaced fy a 37 year old Indonesian girl! Aukland had been taped but he is British.

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S. D. Chaudry – Oxford plant breeder formerly head of Jute Institute – retired may be useful information.

Best to visit Secretary of Agric. & Dacca knows the situation.

3/21 Looked like rain (again) so took my bag to the Terminin ^ checked it during noon (!) hour. After all 9?) the red tape was over left & walked around a bit to Foro & Cohsseo without going in & out to airport & all that. Dull & getting a cold w/cough & sore throat. They did put me in club class – the bubble on top of a 747. Space all to myself with free headphone and free drinks. The trouble with that was I [Bott]

[pg 9] not feel well enough to enjoy the opportunity. Leaving at 23 hours & arriving at 11:15. We had two breakfasts & a movies which I had just seen on Alitalia. Got one beer out of it & did seem to help the cough. No one met me at airport so took a cab to Claridges. Boy! Has that ever changed! The whole lobby & counter is marble – larger rooms & al that & the prices up accordingly a \$35.00 per night! But for a 3 star in a ?? capital very reasonable – used to be a star (my rating) and I liked it better. Same band & vocalist as in previous visits. Laundry & lots of easy Sunday. Called Mehra – he was out but talked with Mrs. M. They are to call ca 7:00 tomorrow. Called Jean after much waiting but no answer. They had given me the wrong times, but reception seemed good. I could [Bott]

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3/22 Cold much better – good to have the rest.

[I do not want to go through everything here. He seems to be sticking to the task and not bar-hopping like he did in earlier ventures. There is an old man, De Vries, who had medical problems in India and was hospitalized. Otherwise there is not much drama, unless you want to get into the various

personalities, some of whom turned out to be the real problem, I suppose. I do not want to write something that would open old wounds or picture Jack Harlan as a complainer. So, I think we can say that he took this task, went to India and then Bangladesh, studied the problems they were having, wrote his report and returned after about a month and reported to Rome, and – I assume – wrote up a report. What happened to the Jute industry after that I do not know, nor do I much care. HVH2
